- Ability to remain calm in difficult situations and identify solutions to problems
- Experience in and be able to work effectively with individual clients and as part of a team.
- Ability to set appropriate professional standards for self and others.
- The ability to recognise that a young person's behaviour and attitude may be governed by past experiences.
- The ability to confront challenging behaviour in a confident and constructive way.

- An understanding that the role isn't a 09:00 – 17:00 and to be flexible to sessions and programmes running over.
- Supportive, empathetic and able to enthuse others.
- The ability to receive constructive feedback from colleagues, line managers and visiting staff and actively make change.
- To keep a professional image at all times and to be seen as a role model for the outdoor industry.
- Has a clear understanding of safe guarding.
- Personal experience in a broad range of outdoor activities.
- Hard worker who is able to work in a team and independently.
- Willingness to be flexible in approach to working and adapt to challenging situations.
- Ability to work flexible hours, including evening and weekends.
- Ability to work away from home on expeditions throughout the UK, over durations of up to 10 days.
- A level of fitness commensurate with the demands of the job.
- To be smart and presentable in appearance.
- Has or is working to gaining a driving licence and the ability to transport oneself to various venues and activity sites.

- Team player with a supportive attitude towards colleagues, lead staff and directors.
- Professional, reliable and punctual.

- Enjoys and embraces the spirit of adventure.
- Understands the impact that nature and the outdoor environment can have on our guests
- Is organised and plans ahead.

- Willing to venture out of your comfort zone and embrace new challenges.
- A positive and keen attitude to all responsibilities and tasks.
- A commitment to promoting environmental awareness.
- A commitment towards developing outdoor activities within the framework of equal opportunities.
- A commitment to safeguarding and a commitment to allow young people the empowerment to make positive decisions and choices in order to protect them from any form of abuse harm or neglect.
